The Apostrophe

Apostrophes are used to either show ownership or to show a letter is missing.

REMEMBER: Apostrophes should not be used anywhere else!

Ownership

In speech we add an s to show ownership. In written English we also add an apostrophe.



Andrew's waterbottle was nearly empty.



The boys' shirts are green.

If a word ends in an s we don't usually have to add another one. Apostrophes showing ownership are only used with nouns.

Missing Letters

An apostrophe can also be used to show that letters have been missed out.



It's my birthday.
It is my birthday.

We're having a party. We are having a party.

I haven't finished blowing up all of the balloons!

I have not finished blowing up all of the balloons!
