Moray eels are huge and live in tropical waters, hunting fish, squid and cuttlefish.






Every autumn, some European common eels migrate over 7,000 km, from the Baltic Sea in Europe to the Sargasso Sea near the West Indies to lay their eggs.



Migrating eels are thought to find their way partly by detecting weak electric currents created by the movement of the water.



When European eels hatch in the Sargasso Sea they are carried northeast by the ocean current, developing as they go into tiny transparent eels called glass eels.
