Gadolinium

Named after Johan Gadolin (Finland, 1760-1852). It was named Gadolinium in 1880. Its symbol is Gd





Named after Pierre Curie




named Curium in 1944.

Its symbol is Cm.




Einsteinium

Named after Albert Einstein (Germany, 1879-1955). It was named Einsteinium in 1952. Its symbol is Es.



Fermium

Named after Enrico Fermi (Italy, 1901-1954). It was named Fermium in 1953. Its symbol is Fm.



Nobelium.

Named after Alfred Nobel (Sweden, 1833-1896). It was named Nobelium in 1958. Its symbol is No.




Lawrencium

Named after Ernest Lawrence (USA, 1901-1958). It was named Lawrencium in 1961. Its symbol is Lr.




Rutherfordium
