

On the Farm








A is for animals. Many different kinds of animals are kept on farms.

D is for duckling.


A duckling is a baby duck.

F is for farmer. A farmer works on a farm.





G is for goat.
Goats are kept for their milk.




H is for hay.

Hay is dried grass and other plants. Many animals on a farm eat hay.






I is for irrigation.
Irrigation means watering crops.





J is for Jersey cow. Jersey cows are kept for their milk.






K is for kid. Kids are baby goats.






L is for lamb. Lambs are baby sheep.






M is for meadow. A meadow is a field covered with grass.

Scarecrows are put in fields to scare away the birds.






T is for tractor.

U is for udder. We get milk from a cow's udders.




V is for vegetables.
