
Space Topic Workshopis Literacy KS2





You are going to write a story set in space. You need to plan your story below before starting to write. Think about the characters, setting, plot for and who you are going to be aiming your story at - young children? older children?


Paying for Space Travel

Try describing your own alien using similes, see if a friend can draw what it looks like from your description.


